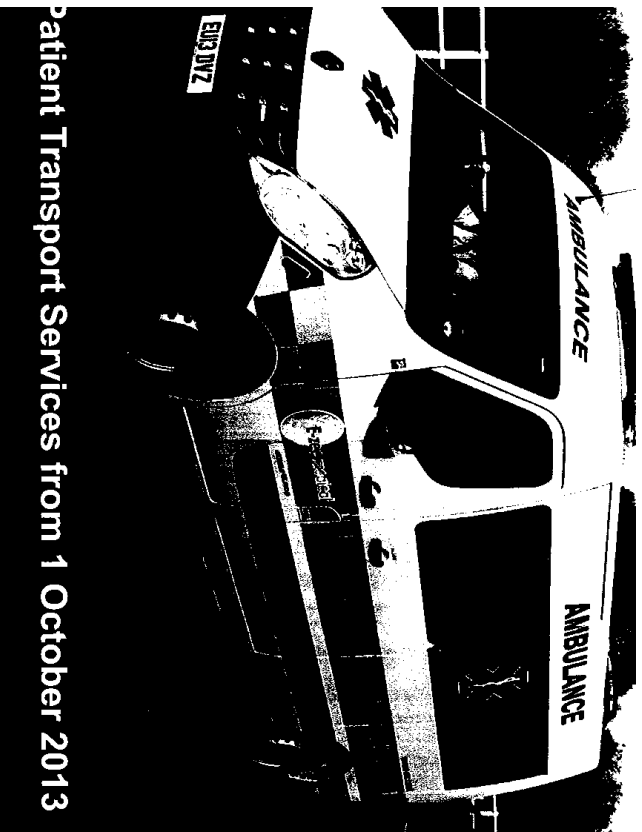

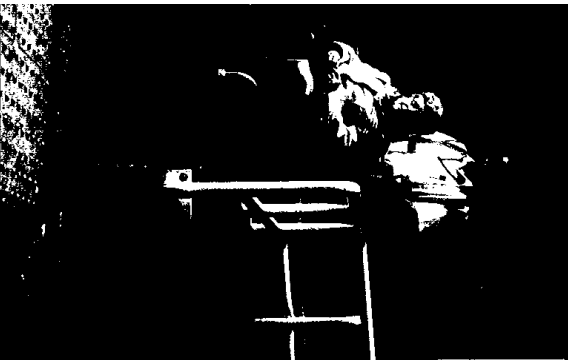

Patient Transport Services from 1 October 2013



Patient Transport Services (PTS) are provided for patients who are being transported to a NHS funded service for NHS treatment and who are deemed medically eligible.

This service is for non-urgent, planned transportation of patients whose medical condition is such that they require the skills or support of clinically trained PTS staff and/or their equipment on/after their journey.

Am I eligible for patient transport?

Eligible patients are those:

- Where their medical condition and their mobility means that they require the skills or support of PTS staff on/after the journey or where it would be detrimental to their condition or recovery if they were to travel by other means;
- Recognised as a parent or guardian where children are being transported.

PTS could also be provided to a patient's escort or carer where their particular skills and/or support are needed. This may be appropriate in the case of accompanying a person with a physical or mental incapacity, a vulnerable adult, or in the case of patients needing a translator. This would need to be agreed for each individual case at the time of booking the transport.

How do I book patient transport?

You or a nominated person on your behalf will book transport directly by calling the Dorset Patient Transport Bureau (Dorset PTB) on our low-rate call number **0300 777 5555**. It would be helpful when calling if you have the following to hand:

- GP name
- GP surgery
- NHS number

The Dorset PTB is open Monday to Friday, 8am through to 6pm.

If I am not eligible for patient transport, what are the alternatives?

The Dorset PTB will direct you to alternative methods of public and volunteer transport. If you are on a low income, you may be able to get financial help from the 'Healthcare Travel Costs Scheme' (HTCS). Call **0300 330 1343** for further details.
